Italian flair comes to the Miami skyline with Brickell Flatiron, a 64-story downtown luxury condo with 527 units that tops off in January and will begin welcoming residents in mid-2019. Already 85 percent sold, the project is being developed by Italian-born Ugo Colombo with interiors by Massimo Iosa Ghini, the Italian architect who designed most of the Ferrari showrooms in Europe as well as the newest one on Biscayne Boulevard here in Miami. Units range in size from 730 to 6,246 square feet and feature an array of Italian-made products, including Barausse custom doors; Snaidero cabinetry, Caesarstone countertops and Zucchetti faucets in the kitchens: Milldue suspended cabinetry in master baths; and polished lealian marble floors, bases and accent walls.
